Project Summary and Deliverables

Vital Strategies is a non-profit international public health organization based in NYC that is conducting clinical trials on tuberculosis treatment regimens in multiple sites outside the United States. We are looking for a 2nd or 3rd year law student in good standing to help us ensure compliance with applicable laws and regulations regarding protection of human subjects in research. More specifically, the project will entail reviewing patient consent forms, identifying certain specified content and logging the information into a tracking form under the supervision of the Counsel, Research & Development. This is a short-term project that is not expected to take more than thirty hours to complete.

Qualities and Qualifications

Candidates must have an ability to closely review documents and be attentive to detail. A science background and an interest in international health or pharmaceutical regulations is a plus, but not mandatory. The project completion target is no more than November 30, 2019. Once the project commences, it must be completed within no more than ten consecutive business dates. Only applicants who are able to meet the timing requirements should apply.

Compensation for the project will be \$15/hour, to be paid following successful completion of deliverables.
